- Examples might include: On the razzle, hitting the town, etc.



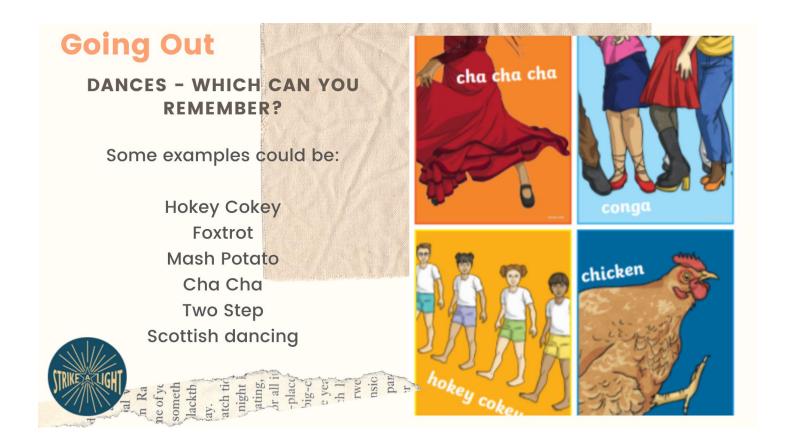
Figure 1: Hairbrush and bus ticket. Image taken by Summer Dean. Copyright - Strike a Light - Arts & Heritage.

"I used to go to the Eldorado milk bar. There was a 4ft Knickerbocker glory in the window. There was a Gaga coffee machine. This was in the early 1950's, '52? That ended in about '61/'62. We used to go to another café on the Old Shoreham Road. We used to have milkshakes once a week for tuppence. There was a cinema in North Street. The 'flea pit' we called it. They used to clean it with disinfectant spray. There was a generator out the back. We saw Laurel and Hardy films there". Rod

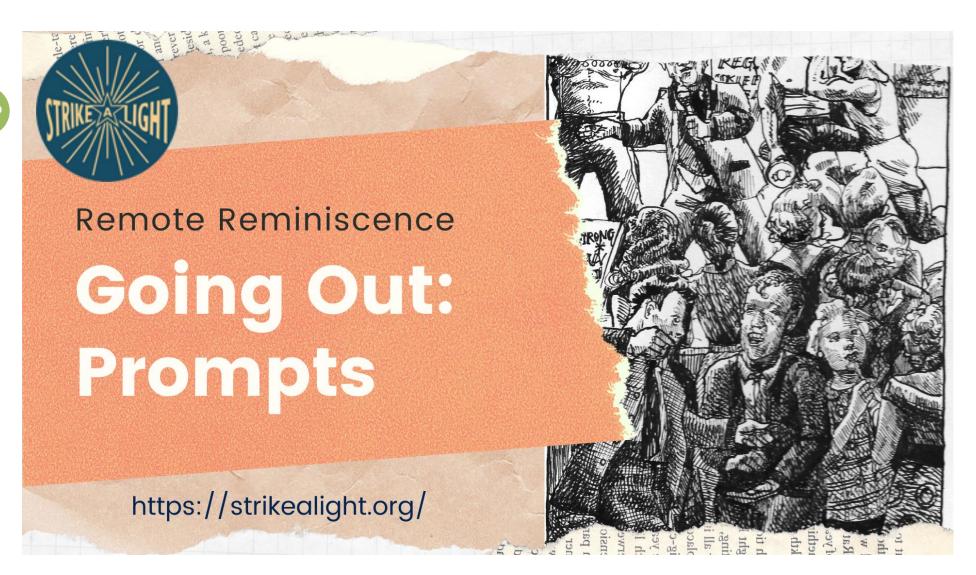
Joyce
